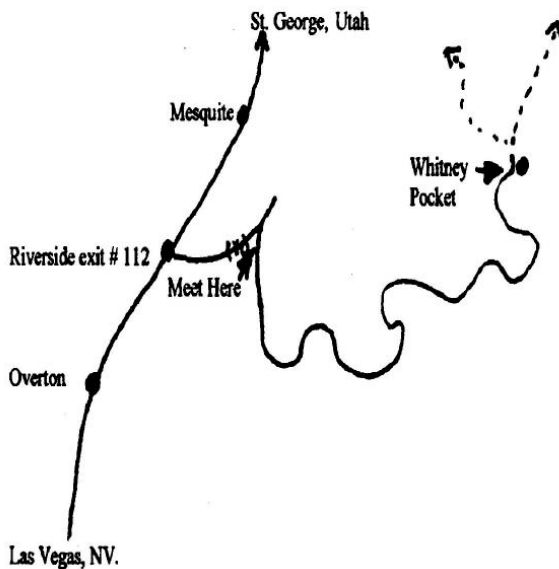

The location is on the map to the left. Allow about 1 to 1 ½ hours travel time from Las Vegas to the site. **From Las Vegas Take I-15 toward Mesquite**, as you go down the hill into the valley that Mesquite is in, take the **Riverside exit #112**, to the right.

About a mile down the road, just after crossing the bridge over the river, there is a "Y" where another road intersects. **YOU MADE IT!** This is the starting point.

We will take off from there and fly a poker run of about 30 miles (paved road) to the barbeque. Plan on the whole day for flying, exploring, hiking, eating, etc. The club is supplying weenies & burgers.

Bring water, pot luck, and anything you want for the day.

There will be planes & helicopters participating.

The average time between landing sites will be 10 to 15 minutes. Bring a pickup truck or convertible to fly from. *And someone to drive it.*

For those wishing to camp out Friday or Saturday night, there are numerous camp spots, but no hookups at Whitney Pocket, the end of the pavement.
